

16. An application for an amateur station licence, made by a college, radio club, society, or similar organization, must be as prescribed in paragraph 11 above, but a licence may be issued only if the following conditions are observed.—

- (a) The rules must set out the objects for which the organization is formed, and outline its method of operation; a copy of the document must be forwarded with the application.
- (b) The names of the officers of the organization, if already elected, or if not, those of the convenors must be stated.
- (c) An undertaking in writing must be furnished to the effect that—
  - (i) the transmitting apparatus will be operated only by, or in the presence of, a person holding an Amateur Operator's Certificate of Proficiency or any First or Second Class Certificate of Proficiency issued by the Postmaster-General's Department; and
  - (ii) the installation will at all times be inaccessible to unauthorized persons.
- (d) The proposals for giving effect to the condition stated in sub-paragraph (c) (ii) above must be clearly indicated.
- (e) Particulars of affiliation with any other organization of amateurs must be stated.

#### DECLARATION OF SECRECY.

17. Every applicant for an amateur station licence, unless he is the holder of a Commercial or an Aircraft Operator's Certificate of Proficiency, must make a Statutory Declaration of secrecy, before a Justice of the Peace or a Commissioner of Declarations, on a form obtainable at any office of the Wireless Branch, and forward it with his application. In the case of serving members of the Defence Forces, however, the declaration may be made before a Naval Lieutenant, an Army Captain, a Flight-Lieutenant, or officer of a higher rank.

#### LICENCE TO BE EXHIBITED.

18. An amateur station licensee must exhibit the licence in the room or other place where the transmitting equipment is located. In the case of a portable or mobile station, the licence must be carried by the licensee.

#### DUPLICATE LICENCE MAY NOT BE ISSUED.

19. In the event of an amateur station licence being lost or destroyed, the owner may not obtain a duplicate. He should, however, have always available the last receipt issued to him on account of either an initial licence or a renewal.

#### RENEWAL OF LICENCE.

20. An amateur station licence is issued for a period of one year. Payment of the renewal fee must be made to the Chief Inspector (Wireless) at least seven days before the date of expiry of the licence.

21. A written notification that the licence is due for renewal will normally be despatched by the Chief Inspector (Wireless) to each licensee, but non-receipt of the notice will not exempt a licensee from the obligation of making payment of the renewal fee within the period specified.

22. An amateur station licence that is not renewed shall automatically become invalid as from the day following that on which the renewal fee is due, and shall, unless satisfactory reasons for the delay are submitted, be terminated by notification to the licensee, in writing, from the Chief Inspector (Wireless).

23. An amateur station licensee who does not desire to renew his licence must notify the Chief Inspector (Wireless), in writing, at least fourteen days before the date of expiry of the licence.

24. Any person whose amateur station licence has been terminated as the result of non-renewal may not be granted a new licence within six months of the date of expiry of the original licence.

#### CANCELLATION OR SUSPENSION OF LICENCE.

25. Any licence granted in respect of an amateur station may be suspended for a specified period, or cancelled on the ground that:—
