

(a) the licensee has failed to comply with any provision of the Wireless Telegraphy Act or Regulations or with any condition of the licence; or

(b) it is considered in the public interest to do so.

26. During any period of suspension of a licence, such licence shall not have any force or effect, but the period of the currency of the licence shall continue, and the renewal date will not be varied.

27. All equipment held in pursuance of a licence that has been cancelled, suspended, or otherwise rendered invalid shall be dismantled to the satisfaction of an authorized officer.

28. Any person whose amateur station licence has been in any way rendered invalid and who continues to operate an amateur station during each period shall be liable to the penalty specified in paragraph 76 of this Handbook.

#### PURPOSES FOR WHICH STATION MAY BE USED.

29. The use of amateur stations is restricted to investigations, research, and/or instruction in wireless telegraphy or telephony without pecuniary interest. Their use for instrumental purposes is confined to schools, institutes, clubs, societies, or other teaching institutions. The broadcasting of any matter to broadcast listeners is not permitted.

30. Except as stated in paragraphs 143, 147, and 148 of this Handbook, an amateur station may be used to communicate only with other amateur stations in countries whose administrations permit the exchange of such communications.

31. Communication with stations associated with expeditions, aircraft, yachts, etc., is prohibited (except in the case of distress or extreme urgency) unless such stations are operating under an amateur licence.

32. An amateur station licensee may transmit and receive, in English, plain language messages relating to experiments, or consisting of remarks, normally be transmitted through the public communication systems, would not normally be transmitted through the public communication systems.

33. The use of amateur stations for the transmission or receipt of messages for third parties, either within or beyond the Commonwealth, or of any message in consideration of payment in cash or kind, or of any item of an advertising nature, direct or indirect, is expressly forbidden. Discussions or conferences relating to matters connected with the trades or occupations of the amateur licensees concerned, which would be conducted normally by means of the public services available, will not be permitted, e.g., a licensee who is engaged in any trade or profession and uses his station for the purpose of furthering his knowledge of such trade or profession with a pecuniary interest, or for obtaining information regarding costs, methods of production, advances in design, etc., which is not available to other persons, is guilty of an infringement of the regulations under the Wireless Telegraphy Act. Any such infringement may render the licence liable to suspension or cancellation.

34. The use of amateur stations for the transmission of music or any form of entertainment is prohibited. However, single audio frequency tones may be transmitted for tests of short duration.

35. An amateur station shall not be used for transmitting any matter connected with social or political propaganda.

36. In the amateur frequency bands from 60 Mc/s. upwards, amateur station licensees are permitted to relay simultaneous transmissions emanating from other amateur stations, if the concurrence of the licensees concerned is obtained. However, unless for specific purposes and specially authorized by the Chief Inspector (Wireless), retransmission by recordings will not be permitted.

37. Any amateur station licensee relaying transmissions from other amateur stations must, in all cases, identify his station in accordance with paragraph 134 of this Handbook.

#### PORTABLE AND MOBILE AMATEUR STATIONS.

38. Amateur station licenses are granted, normally, for operation from a fixed address, but licenses for portable or mobile stations may also be granted to qualified persons for operation from designated points or areas
